



Andy Warhol was an American artist in the movement known as pop art. Warhol became famous worldwide as a painter, avant-garde film maker, record producer, author, and public figure known for his membership in widely diverse social circles that included Bohemian street people, distinguished intellectuals, Hollywood celebrities, and wealthy aristocrats. Warhol coined the phrase “15 minutes of fame,” which refers to the fleeting condition of celebrity that attaches to an object of media attention, then passes to come new object as soon as the public’s attention span is exhausted. His painting subjects are instantly recognizable such as the Campbell’s soup can and Coca Cola bottles.
